The Mass is the most powerful of all prayers, so it is a very effective way to pray for loved ones.

While you can personally offer your prayers at Mass for a special intention, requesting that a priest say a Mass for your intention can be even more powerful.

Because of the particular role of the priest as mediator between God and man, acting *"in persona Christi"* when offering the holy sacrifice of the Mass, it is usually considered that special graces may be obtained when he applies the Mass to a particular intention.



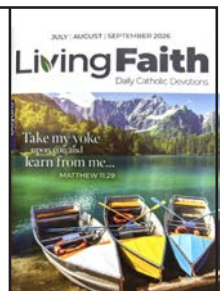
You can offer a Mass for family members, friends, or any special intention, but Masses offered for the dead

Mary's Mantle Consecration is a self-guided spiritual retreat that shapes and renews busy individuals, families, prayer groups and parishes.

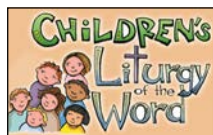

Again the Knights gave a very generous monetary donation, allowing many cooks and bakers to prepare meals and muffins for 30 families to enjoy.

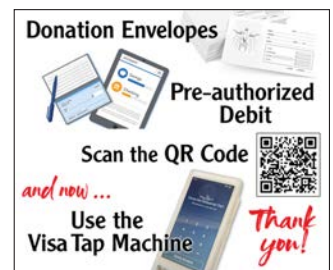

MANY WAYS to SUPPORT OUR PARISH

The Parish has various options for parishioners and guests to make donations to our general collections. A **Visa Credit/Debit Tap Machine** is located at the kiosk in the south foyer together with an instruction board. This now provides families with four methods to donate:

1. Use collection envelopes by registering with the Parish;
2. Use a Pre-Authorized payment plan from your bank account;
3. Scan the QR code on the back of the pews;
4. Use the Visa Tap Machine
